

~ Harvest Tags ~
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Please read all instructions before you begin.

Supply List...

Cardstock (I use tan parchment)
Inkjet Printer (laser will also work)
12" Strips of Homespun or Jute
Scissors or Xacto Knife & Straight Edge
1/4" Round Hole Paper Punch
Walnut Ink (optional)
Emory Board or fine sand paper

Printing...

Print these on cardstock, I use a tan parchment, but brown craft or even white will work perfectly. When printing to insure the proper size, make sure you have "Auto Rotate & Center" CHECKED - and that "Page Scaling" is set to NONE. You do not want to have "Shrink to Fit Page" checked either. (these options will appear in the print menu)



Cutting...

Cut just inside the tag outline, so the lines won't show when you're finished.

Aging...

If you wish to give your tags a stained, aged look, you can do this with 1/2 t. of walnut ink crystals mixed in 2 c. warm water. If the ink in your printer is not colorfast you will have to age your cardstock first, otherwise the ink will run. I use an Epson printer and Durabrite ink which will not run when it gets wet.

Finishing...

When your tags are dry, punch a hole in the center at the top of your tag. Double a piece of homespun of jute and thread through the hole, looping the ends through the center of the folded piece near the hole. You can use an emory board or fine grit sandpaper to soften the edges if you wish.

We hope you enjoy using these E-Tags.

Feel free to sell the finished products made from these tags, however mass production is prohibited.
